Data Protection (GDPR)



As many of you will be aware, in 2018 there was an update to legislation around how organisations must collect, process and store people's personal information. At K&D Befriending we have always been very mindful of treating information from clients and volunteers with great care and do not share this information with others. To be in line with new regulations we have included with this newsletter a copy of our new '*Privacy Statement*'. Jessa who has been visiting Beatrice now for many years writes:



"I have been visiting Beatrice for 14 years this year - we meet once a week for approx 3 hours.

We get on very well together and have similar tastes. We like to visit Kirktown Garden Centre, in Stonehaven - it has a good shop which sells clothes & gifts and the food is varied soup, sandwiches, cakes ... it also serves hot meals.

As well as the main restaurant it has a conservatory or, in summer, tables outside. It has a large carpark (including disabled spaces) with overflow parking if needed.

We enjoy visiting it in December as we enjoy the Christmas displays".

Tackling social isolation and loneliness

There is an increasing awareness of the negative impact social isolation and loneliness can have on people's lives, affecting their mental and physical health. Befriending is a way of tackling this and we are proud to see many hours each week across Kincardine and Deeside being spent in companionship between clients and volunteers. Sometimes a visit at home for chat, crosswords, cuppas, laughter and sharing stories or for others, outings to local community venues, connecting with the local community and countryside. It is always heartening to hear first hand the impact these relationships can have in brightening peoples' week, enjoyed by clients and befrienders alike.

It was good too to see Kincardine and Deeside Befriending highlighted as an example of good practice in the latest Health and Social Care Locality Plan for Kincardine and Mearns.
